





1917 - 2003



“Our next Distinguished Service Award recipient had his first byline in his hometown newspaper in 1929 when he began covering junior high sports. He continues to write for the newspaper today.

After graduating from Creighton University in 1939, he returned to his hometown and his father’s newspaper to serve as sports editor.

During World War II, he served as a briefing and information officer on General George W. Patton’s staff.

He returned to his hometown newspaper in 1946, serving as news and sports editor. When his father died in 1949, he was named editor.

Though he sold the newspaper in 1983, he has remained on staff and continues covering the news today. Asking about his longevity, he jokes, ‘I came with the building.’

The quintessential community journalist, our recipient lived, worked and raised a family in his hometown while maintaining the objectivity and fairness expected – but not easily accomplished – in such situations.

While doing so, he provided strong leadership in his community. He was an original board member when the local hospital opened 51 years ago. He helped promote local tourism and was a leading proponent for economic development in his county – a county recognized throughout the state for its economic development success.

A patriot and firm believer in the value of our National Guard, our Distinguished Service Award recipient played a vital role in the construction of a new Army National Guard Armory in his hometown several years ago.

He has served his nation, his community and his profession for nearly 75 years and tonight we are pleased and proud to present the Iowa Newspaper Association’s Distinguished Service Award to Paul Gauthier of Corning and the Adams County Free Press.”





Dannie attended country school in McPherson. He lived most of his life in the Prescott and Adams County area and has lived in Creston since November, 2008.



Harry William Grundman, the son of Harry Charles and Lillian Mae (Keever) Grundman, was born July 14, 1924, on a farm near Prescott, Adams County, Iowa. Harry entered Eternal Rest Wednesday, January 29, 2003, at his home in Corning, Iowa, at the age of seventy-eight years, six months, and fifteen days.

Harry attended a rural Adams County school and graduated from Prescott High School with the class of 1942. On December 27, 1946, Harry and Enid Rodgers were united in marriage in Mt. Etna, Iowa. Five children were born to bless this union.

On July 18, 1944, Harry entered the United States Army during World War II. He fought in the Battle of the Bulge and other European campaigns. Harry received the Purple Heart and was honorably discharged on May 6, 1946, in Jefferson Barracks, Missouri. Following his return from service he and Enid were married. Before moving to Corning, Harry worked for the military as a terminal-leave bond officer in Omaha.

Harry worked in the sales industry in Nebraska and farmed near Prescott. During his farming years Harry was instrumental in developing the National Farmers Organization and was elected its first president. He entered into the insurance business in Corning in 1960 as the owner of the Grundman Insurance Agency and Secretary Manager of Adams Mutual Insurance Association, retiring in 1994. During his professional career, he served on the Mutual Insurance Association of Iowa Board of Directors. He also devoted more than twenty years to Grinnell Mutual Reinsurance Company on the Board of Directors, including three years as chairman.



Harry helped revive the Corning Chamber of Commerce in the early 1960's and served as its president in 1963 and was a charter member of that group's Ambassadors. He was active in promoting local federal housing, now known as Westgate Housing, and was a charter member of the Resource, Conservation and Development office in Creston. He was on the local YMCA board for many years, coached Pee Wee baseball, and served as president of the Quarterback Club. Harry was active on various committees of the Corning Methodist Church of which he was a long-time member. He was a Rotarian and Paul Harris fellow. Active in Adams County Republican politics, Harry also was a Mason and an American Legion and VFW member.

Preceding Harry in death were his parents and sister, Nina Mae Krauth.

Harry is survived by his wife of fifty-six years, Enid R. Grundman of Corning, Iowa; his children, Michael (Rebecca) Grundman of Corning, Iowa, Debra (James) Blume of Johnston, Iowa, LeAnn (Philip) Morris of Lenox, Iowa, Mark (Donna) Grundman of Crosswell, Michigan, Matthew (Debra) Grundman of Bedford, Iowa; fourteen grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

Although Harry was a business and community leader, his greatest loves were his wife and family.
