Robert Clark Templeton, 62, nationally known artist and former Corning resident, died Tuesday, July 16, at his home and studio in Woodbury, Conn., after suffering a heart attack.

He was reknowned for his portraits of President Lyndon Johnson and Jimmy Carter as well as others

ranging from sports figures to civil rights leaders.

Mr. Templeton completed three portraits of President Carter. One is in the Hall of Presidents of the Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery, another at the Carter Presidential Center in Atlanta and a third in the

Georgia Senate chamber.

Among his works were portraits of civil rights leader Martin Luther King; Rosa Parks, who refused to go to the back of a bus in Alabama; Eldridge Cleaver, author of "Soul on Ice": baseball stars Stan Musial and Red Schoendienst and their families; movie stars Clark Gable, Joe E. Brown, Ray Bolger; and bowling champion Don Carter.

He was awarded the Vanderslice Scholarship for the next two years and had his first oneman show at the Kansas City Art Institute at 19.
