



Dr. Melvin Reed Beemer November 10, 1918 ~ April 5, 2010



Melvin Reed Beemer was the son of George and Jessie (Whipple) Beemer. He was born on November 10, 1918 on the family farm in Holt Township in Taylor County, Iowa. Little Melvin started riding his pony to the Gravel Point School at the age of four. Dad loved school and learning. In 1935, he graduated from Gravity High, aged 16, then worked on the family farm the next year. He excelled in hard work, baseball, basketball, and even tried boxing.

Melvin was an only child until he was ten. One day, he came home to a baby sister, Dorothy. He'd had no inkling, which was the way it was in those days. Because of the age difference, they didn't really get to know each other until adulthood with families. Dorothy married Gerry Rainforth of Sharpsburg and they lived with son Larry on the Whipple farm, a wedding gift from George and Jessie. We kids liked going down to the farm to help with the animals and ride horses. Sadly, Dorothy died in 1958, aged 29.

In 1937, Dad went off to Iowa State College to study Veterinary Medicine. Besides his school work, he handled the dry cleaning at the fraternity house and waited tables in the girls' dorm. That's how he met Marney from the west coast. As the fastest waiter on the floor, he dropped a tray of dirty dishes on her. He had to find out her name to pay the cleaning bill. She'd already nicknamed him "Blackie". It has never been said how Dad happened to 'trip-up' that day!!!!

Our parents married on July 30, 1942 and settled in Corning, where Dad bought a large animal veterinary practice. He and the other vet in town, Doc Jennings, had a big job maintaining strict animal disease controls in Adams County during WWII. Dad's classmate, George Gitz, joined him briefly in partnership in the early 1950s. Dad retired in 1986, when he sold his practice to Dr. Wayne Rychnovsky. Mom and Dad began spending the winter months on the Pacific Ocean, either in Oregon or Hawaii.

Dad was a numbers man and expectations were set high when he kept reminding us that he had NEVER used an eraser in school! He read prolifically - biographies, historical novels, Louie L'Amour and emails from us - using his specs from Wal-Mart. No book was too thick or print too small. Dad also enjoyed his favorite desserts - apple pie a la mode, angel food cake and peanut brittle.

Dad had our house on the hill built on five acres in 1948. Our family included "Missie", the dog, and three little girls. We got a cow and a pony named "Betsy" as soon as possible. Then the prodigal son, Scott, was born and lastly, Polly. Mom loved her home and Dad his yard and garden. It was nothing for Dad to rise at 5am to pick a bushel of





beans to leave on the back step before he went to the office. Mom froze huge quantities of fresh garden produce annually. Our parents developed colorful flowerbeds around the homestead. Dad kept the house and fence freshly painted and the grounds mowed. He was always working! Mom would plan and execute outings to break the routine. Family trips included parts of America but mostly to the Oregon beach house, where our other grandparents, Ella & Scotty Scott, lived.

Over the years, there were other dogs, cows, ponies, several cats, and a string of parakeets - "Perkys" I, II, III. Mom taught them to talk during her household duties. We raised rabbits, chickens and pigs. The last event in Dad's busy day was relaxing to the splash of milk hitting the side of the pail with his head nestled into the flank of

"Theresa", our Guernsey milk cow. Naturally, we loved animals and learned lots about them over the years. The girls were horse-crazy and rode all over town, winter and summer.

Dad posted the odd pig or dog out in the driveway if the office was closed. Sometimes we'd watch, and it was always fun riding in the pickup on calls with Dad. We'd bounce along over the country roads singing 'The Old Gray Mare'. We kids loved going down to the office. Dad's office man usually had a full cookie jar or a buck for us to run across to the bakery. We were always on a diet in the Beemer household!

We completed our college education and were encouraged to go forth and seek our fortunes. Dad probably thought his life would slow down. However, there was a time when none of us lived in the continental USA - Alaska, Hawaii, Egypt, Germany, Australia. When Lynne organized an African safari from Cairo, Dad thought it would be much cheaper just to go to the Zoo! After several trips to Europe, he announced that if he visited one more castle or cathedral, he would go on strike! In Australia, well, he just didn't know there were that many sheep in the world! Alaska was even colder and grayer in winter than the Oregon coast, but Dad never tired of Hawaii. He relished a few winter months in a milder climate.

Not long ago, Dad remarked that it probably would have been a very different life if he hadn't married our adventurous mother, who grew up in Washington state. She took him out of his Iowa Comfort Zone. Sharing their children's lives on several continents is knowing the joy of family to its fullest. And, when all is said and done, having our parents long enough to become our best friends is a memory, we Beemer children will cherish.


Down On The Farm

Hazel and Harry went to high school in Corning, driving back and forth the first two years. She and Harry were in the orchestra where Hazel played the violin and Harry played the trumpet. Harry said many times, "I don't know how good we were but we made a lot of noise!" Hazel says she was not a good student, but she graduated in a class of 47 students and was the president of her class. During the test for her teaching certificate, another student passed her the answers for the spelling section. She said the girl was very homely and unpopular, but she was very popular with Hazel because Hazel would not have passed without her help. Hazel taught five terms of school in a country school and taught Sunday school at the Stringtown Church.

Hazel married Thomas Edwin Butler at the Plainview Farm on November 30, 1922. Edwin's sister played and Irwin Bar sang the "Star of The East". Edwin and Hazel overheard that there were some mean tricks being planned so their friends, Ray Campbell and Roy Pugh, ran off with them to escape. Hazel remembered hearing Floyd Neal yelling, "Hell, they're in the same car!" Hazel and Edwin went on to Creston and stayed at the Iowana Hotel.

Edwin and Hazel lived on the Butler Family Farm, four miles southwest of Kent on Hwy 25. Edwin and Hazel owned ground in four counties and farmed in three: Ringgold, Union and Taylor counties. Hazel and Edwin had one child, Jack Reese Butler, born February 29, 1928. Edwin hired a man named Vessie Hooten to work for him. Mr. Hooten and 12 children, the 9th was an eleven-year-old girl named Pearl. Edwin noticed that Pearl was very ambitious and decided to ask Mr. Hooten if he and Hazel could take Pearl on a family vacation and to keep her permanently as their foster child when they returned. Mr. Hooten gave his permission because he felt Hazel and Edwin could provide for her better than he could. Pearl soon came walking over the hill carrying a paper bag containing her belongings and stayed.

Jack and Pearl have given Hazel and Edwin a grand total of seven grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren and one great- grandchild.
